Risk Assessed Practices for the Eucharist from 25-07-2021.

Everyone is asked to be sensitive to the concerns of all attending church and to note that this risk assessment is under constant review.

1. When entering church to attend worship, unless a person is exempt, a face covering should be worn. The face covering may be removed when in position in a pew but should be replaced to leave church or when moving around among people in church.
2. Track and trace will continue at government/churches request.
3. Every other pew will in nave now be designated for seating. There should be a max of 4 people who are not from the same household in a pew – or 6 people from the same household.
4. Hands should be sanitized on entering and leaving church, and before and after receiving Holy Communion.
5. People wishing to make a physical offering (say envelope) should leave their offering on the plate at the back of church as they enter the building – an offertory of the plated collection will be made; the elements of bread and wine will be placed on the credence table before the service begin.
6. Singing from hymn books will begin on 25th July.
7. The use of existing service order books will be reintroduced.
8. The physical passing of the peace will remain suspended. People are asked to acknowledge others in a non-contact way.
9. Communion will continue to be administered to people seated in their pew – the shared cup will not be re-introduced.
10. End of service refreshments will not be served on Sundays.
11. People are requested not to linger in church after service ends.
